Dr. Weinstein is the founding director of the Arizona Telemedicine Program. While a Massachusetts General Hospital pathology resident, he participated in rendering diagnoses on some of the first telemedicine cases of the MGH-Logan International Airport telemedicine program, in the spring of 1968.

Decades later, he turned his attention to telepathology. In 1986, he introduced the term "telepathology" into the English language. He invented, patented, and commercialized robotic telepathology and is often referred to as the "Father of Telepathology." In addition to being President Emeritus of the American Telemedicine Association, he has received the Lifetime Achievement Award of the Association for Pathology Informatics and has been inducted into the United States Distance Learning Association Hall of Fame. The national award winning, state-wide Arizona Telemedicine Program, founded in 1996, links 160 sites in 70 communities, and has provided telemedicine services to 1.3 million patients in Arizona.

Howard Yonas, MD



Distinguished Professor and Chairman Department of Neurosurgery University of New Mexico School of Medicine

Dr. Yonas obtained his medical degree from Ohio State University. He completed internship and residency in Neurosurgery at Case Western Reserve University. Between internship and residency he served in the US Air Force

as a flight surgeon. He became a tenured professor in 1988 and was named the Peter J. Jannetta Professor of Neurosurgery in 1995. Dr. Yonas served as the Vice Chair of the department and the Director of Cerebrovascular Surgery. Dr. Yonas helped create and served as the Co-director of the UPMC Stroke Institute. Dr. Yonas joined the University of New Mexico as chair of a new department of neurological surgery. He received the title of distinguished professor of UNM in 2012.

Dr. Yonas is the PI on a 15.1 million dollar CMS Innovations Grant awarded September 2014. The grant A.C.C.E.S.S. "Access to Critical Cerebral Emergency Support Services" will put state of the art tele-health/medicine equipment in 30 New Mexico Hospitals to provide emergent neurological and neurosurgical consultations. The model is uniquely low cost and potentially widely applicable.




